Math

**We will continue to use addition and subtraction to solve math problems.

**We will work with place value (tens and ones). We will name & record the tens & ones in a two digit number.
(27 = 2 tens & 7 ones).



WRITING

Our focus in writing will be NARRATIVE WRITING. This type of writing is more like traditional story writing. Students will use an opening and closing sentence, and possibly, temporal/transition words (first, next, then, last), when writing their story.

Please encourage your child to write at home. Students should use neat handwriting, beginning capital letters, & ending punctuation when writing. Past spelling words are expected to be spelled correctly.
