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The second nine weeks we will begin working some different problem types that will be somewhat new to your child. You will see a few of the types of problems listed below and we recommend that you spend a few minutes posing these types of problems to your child to solve. Sometimes changing the names in the story to familiar people to your child helps, if your child is struggling with the amounts in the problem you can decrease the numbers, or if they are solving fairly easily you can always make the amounts larger. One thing we would like to stress is to have your child verbally tell you how they solved the problem. They have learned that there are so many different ways to solve and there is not just one way to solve. You will be truly amazed at the explanation given. That is a promise☺! 1. Lucy has 3 fewer apples than Julie. Julie has 5 apples. How many apples does Lucy have?
